## **COMMONWEALTH of VIRGINIA Department of Employment Dispute Resolution COMPLIANCE RULING OF DIRECTOR**

In the matter of old Dominion University Ruling Numbers 2005-1017 and 2005-1018 May 6, 2005

For the reasons discussed below, the grievant's March 21 and March 23, 2005 grievances are consolidated and will proceed to hearing together. The hearing officer, in his discretion, may address the two actions separately in one decision, or in two separate decisions.

## FACTS

The grievant was formerly employed by the agency as an Administrative and Program Specialist III. On February 21, 2005, she was suspended pending an agency investigation into allegations of improper procedures related to changes in student records. On March 15, the grievant was issued a Group III Written Notice with termination of her employment. On March 21, 2005, she initiated a grievance to challenge her February 21, 2005 suspension. On March 23<sup>rd</sup>, she initiated another grievance challenging her termination. The parties mutually agreed to consolidate the two grievances for the management step and qualification phases. Upon consultation by EDR, both parties also agree to consolidation for hearing.

## **DISCUSSION**

This Department may consolidate grievances with or without a request from either party whenever more than one grievance is pending involving the same parties, legal issues, and/or factual background.<sup>1</sup> EDR strongly favors consolidation and will order consolidation unless there is a persuasive reason to process the grievances individually.<sup>2</sup>

This Department finds that consolidation of the March 23<sup>rd</sup> grievance with the March 21<sup>st</sup> grievance is appropriate. The grievances involve the same parties, potential witnesses, share a common factual background, and are essentially intertwined. Also,

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both parties agree and consolidation is not impracticable in this instance. This Department's rulings on compliance are final and nonappealable.<sup>3</sup>
